Canned Food and Book Drive By Jessica Shipps



Canning Project By Julia Item

The Canning Project recently made homemade applesauce. Applesauce is delicious on its own but can also be used as an ingredient in baking. Applesauce can replace eggs and fat in many recipes. Here is a recipe for Applesauce Chocolate Chip Cookies:

Ingredients:

2 cups flour

1/2 tsp baking soda

1/2 TBS cornstarch

1/4 tsp salt

1/4 cup sugar

1/2 cup brown sugar

1/4 cup canola oil

1/4 cup Wacky Apple cinnamon applesauce (or 1 small container worth)

1 large egg

1 tsp vanilla

1 1/2 cups chocolate chips

Directions:

Combine flour, baking soda, cornstarch and salt in a medium sized bowl. In another bowl combine sugars, oil, applesauce, egg and vanilla. Mix the dry ingredients in with the wet ingredients. Pour in the chocolate chips and mix in well. Chill cookie dough in the fridge for 30 minutes up to overnight. Scoop cookies out onto a sprayed baking sheet and bake in oven preheated to 350 for about 10 minutes.
