4-H FAMILIES AFFECTED BY THE CALIFORNIA WILDFIRES

From The State 4-H Office and California 4-H Foundation

Since the devastating fires last week in Southern California, many of you have been contacting the State 4-H Office and California 4-H Foundation to ask how you can best help 4-H families in the areas that were affected.

As many of you know, the systems and policies for accepting and transferring gifts within UC were designed to help further advance the educational and outreach activities of our organization. However, the financial support people are wishing to give is focused on helping 4-H families in these counties get back on their feet. Knowing this, we asked staff how we can best direct people to provide support to families impacted in their county. Here are their responses:

Orange County -

Some 4-H families in Orange County sustained property damage in last week's wild fires; however, staff and volunteers are requesting funds be sent to surrounding counties where greater losses were sustained and the need is much greater
